Bruce Pascal, who collects the world's most valuable Hot Wheels cars, is head judge for a family-friendly exhibition of the popular toys. Proceeds from the Hot Wheels exhibit will benefit CASA of Monterey County. Pasadera Concours events also support the Bridge Restoration Ministry in Pacific Grove.

"The Concours at Pasadera has great cars, great food and phenomenal artwork by poster artist Simon Bull, but without crowds or traffic. It's a casually elegant and unforgettable event," says Barnett.
